COVID GUIDANCE

Is it Safe to Travel?

As restrictions start to ease and the world begins to open up again after numerous national lockdowns prompted by the COVID-19 pandemic, many people are looking forward to travelling internationally again whilst still feeling wary about how to do this as safely as possible.

Once it is legal to travel again, official advice is to keep checking the travel guidance in your home country and the country you are planning on visiting right up to the day that you travel to ensure you are following the latest safety advice. This may include any documentation you need to bring, whether there are quarantine laws that will apply when you return to your country, and what health and safety measures you will be required to follow whilst on transport such as planes or trains.

If you begin to feel unwell or show signs of coronavirus before you travel you will not be allowed to leave the country. At the time of writing, you are required to take a COVID-19 test up to 3 days before you travel back to the UK and will have to take further tests on arrival back in the country.

At present, you are also required to present a negative coronavirus test result to your airline no more than 48 hours before traveling to Italy. You are not currently required to quarantine on arrival, unless you do not have proof of a negative test.

Whilst abroad, it is recommended that you follow the country's safety advice and take precautions such as social distancing, avoiding

crowded areas, wearing a mask and frequently washing your hands.

You can also read general travel advice from the National Travel Health Network and Centre here. At the time of writing, our current booking policy for holidays in 2021 applies to any new villa bookings taken by the end of June 2021. If measures issued by public authorities related to the COVID-19 health emergency such as national lockdowns, closure of borders, tourist or non-essential travel restrictions and quarantine obligations prevent your stay, Italian Breaks will grant the possibility to change the booking period or refund the full amount already paid for the rental without applying any penalty.

However, this policy does not apply if you are unable to attend your villa due to personal reasons, such as flight cancellations or illness that includes testing positive for coronavirus before you travel.

If you're reading this after June 2021, then our booking policy may have changed, depending on new travel guidance..., so please <u>visit our website</u> for the most up to date information before making a booking.

It is recommended that you purchase travel insurance that can provide security and peace of mind in the case of any last-minute changes to your holiday plans because of changes to travel restrictions caused by coronavirus. SEE PISA'S LEANING TOWER



Agnolotti with Pumpkin Filling

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin purée
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan, plus more for sprinkling
- 1/8 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon lemon zest
- Salt and pepper
- 18 round or square wonton wrappers
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/4 cup crème fraîche
- Pumpkin seeds, toasted and shelled

- 1. Mash pumpkin purée, Parmesan, sugar, and lemon zest in a medium bowl. Season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Arrange wonton wrappers on a work surface. Brush edges with lightly beaten egg. Place 1 teaspoon filling on bottom half; fold top half over, gently pressing edges to seal.
- 3. Boil ravioli in salted water until just tender, about 3 minutes.
- 4. Melt butter with crème fraîche in a sauté pan. Add ravioli and 2 tablespoons pasta cooking liquid; toss to coat.
- 5. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Top with grated Parmesan and pumpkin seeds (pepitas).

RIDE A GONDOLA



Osso Buco with Milanese Risotto



Ingredients

- 1 ½ kg veal shin
- 1 tbsp olive oil 1 onion,
- 1 large, peeled carrot
- 1 tbsp tomato puree
- 100ml white wine
- 500ml veal or beef stock
 Ingredients for the Milanese Risotto:
- 2 shallots
- 25g clarified butter
- 360g risotto rice
- 50ml white wine
- Pinch of saffron
- 600-700ml chicken stock
- 25g grated Parmigiano Reggiano cheese

- 1. Heat oil in a large casserole dish and brown the veal on all sides. Once the meat has seared, remove it from the pan and keep to one side.
- 2. Chop the onion and carrot finely. Add to the pan and fry on low heat for around 10 minutes until soft.
- 3. Add the tomato puree to the vegetables and cook for a further 3 minutes. Stir in the wine and allow it to reduce by two thirds.
- 4. Add the cooked Osso Buco to the pan along with the stock and season with salt and pepper. Bring the ingredients to the boil then reduce the heat to a gentle simmer and cook for 90 minutes.

- 5. To make the risotto, chop the shallots and add them to a pan with the melted clarified butter. Fry for 5 minutes.
- 6. Add the risotto rice to the pan and cook for 2 minutes. Add the wine and simmer the rice until the liquid has all been absorbed.
- 7. Add the saffron to the rice and then the stock a little at a time, ensuring each batch has been absorbed before adding the next. Once all the liquid is absorbed, the rice should be cooked al dente.
- 8. Stir in the cheese to the cooked rice and serve with the Osso Buco.






EXPLORE MATERA

Spaghetti Vongole

Ingredients

- 1 kg small clams
- 15g fresh flat-leaf parsley
- 4 cloves of garlic
- 10 cherry tomatoes
- 250ml white wine
- 400g dried spaghetti
- Extra virgin olive oil
- 1-2 dried red chillies

1. Sort through your clams and dispose of any that aren't tightly closed. Add

dried spaghetti to a pan of boiling water and cook until it is al dente.

2.Heat a pan and add the olive oil, chopped garlic cloves, parsley stalks, chopped tomatoes and dried chilli. Stir for a few minutes and then add the clams and the wine.

3. Shake the pan and put a lid on it. The clams will be cooked in 3 - 4 minutes, and when all of them have opened take the pan off the heat.

4.Add the cooked pasta to the other pan and add the parsley leaves. Stir everything together and serve immediately.







Delicate Lake Antipasto

Ingredients

- 1 whole pike
- 1 whole whitefish
- 1 carrot
- 1 onion
- 1 stalk of celery
- 10g of butter
- 1/2 Glass of White Wine
- 200g of prawns
- Olive Oil
- Chopped Parsley
- 1/2 a lemon
- 150g of olives
- 100g of boiled Peas

- 1. Fillet a pike and a whitefish and put the flesh to one side.
- 2.Use the head and the bones to prepare a fish broth, boiling them in the water together with a carrot, an onion and a stalk of celery.
- 3.Place a knob of butter in a saucepan with the fillets of whitefish and pike, add salt and pepper and brown them gently.
- 4. Then pour in ½ glass of white wine and two ladles of fish broth (filtered to remove impurities or bones). Shell some prawns, add them to the other fish and put everything in the oven at 180° for 5 minutes.

- 5. When fully cooked, remove the fish from the saucepan to dry on a paper towel.
- 6.Now prepare a little sauce to dress the fish. Pour some olive oil into a casserole dish with some chopped parsley, the juice of a half lemon, two roughly chopped tomatoes with seeds removed, some olives without stones and boiled peas. Stir gently and leave everything for about ten minutes.
- 7.Place the fish on serving dishes together with greens.







CLIMB MONTE SOLARO

The SP71 is a 25km stretch of road that runs along Sardinia's Costa del Sud between Chia and Porto di Teulada and is one of the most scenic routes around the entire island. If you've hired a car to explore Sardinia then you can enjoy panoramic views of the ocean on one side and plenty of Sardinian towns and countryside on the other as you drive; a perfect way to spend long, sunny days when you want to experience as much of the island as possible.

Monte Solaro is the highest point on Capri and offers the best views on the whole island. There's an easy hiking path that takes you right to the top starting in Anacapri that is suitable for the majority of walkers or you can take a chairlift for a truly breathing experience of rising up above the whole island and surrounding ocean.





Ingredients for the rice

- 300g of arborio rice
- 1/4 teaspoon of crushed saffron
- 450ml of water or stock
- 2 tablespoons of grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese
- 4 teaspoons of unsalted butter

Ingredients for the filling

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- ½ a small onion
- 3 tablespoons chopped carrot
- 3 tablespoons chopped celery
- 85g of ground beef
- 85g of ground pork
- 2 tablespoons dry red wine
- 2 teaspoons tomato paste
- 200g tomato purée

Ingredients for the coating

- 50g all-purpose flour
- 2 large eggs
- 100ml cup water
- 400g breadcrumbs

Sicilian Arancini

- 1.Add the water or stock, rice and saffron to a pan. Cover and simmer until the rice is cooked.
- 2.Remove from the heat and stir in the cheese and butter. Spread the mixture onto a plate and leave it to cool.
- 3. For the filling, heat the onion, carrots and celery to a pan and heat until softened. Add the ground meat and cook until it is browned.
- 4.Add the red wine to the mixture and cook for around a minute until the alcohol has reduced. Add the tomato puree and cook on a low heat for 20 minutes until the mixture is thick. Set to one side and leave to cool as well.
- 5.Once your ingredients are cool, assemble the arancini balls. Take a tablespoon of rice in your hand, then

add a teaspoon of meat filling in the middle of this. Close the rice around the filling until you have a ball shape and set to one side.

6.When all your balls have been assembled, whisk together the flour, water and eggs until smooth. Spread the breadcrumbs out on a plate. Gently roll each rice ball in the wet mixture and then the breadcrumbs, coating evenly.

7. Either put your arancini in the fridge for half an hour to cool, or fry right away. Heat around 2 inches of oil in a pan until hot, then put 2-3 balls into the oil at a time and cook for around 3 minutes.

8.Transfer to a paper towel and leave to drain. Serve hot.




